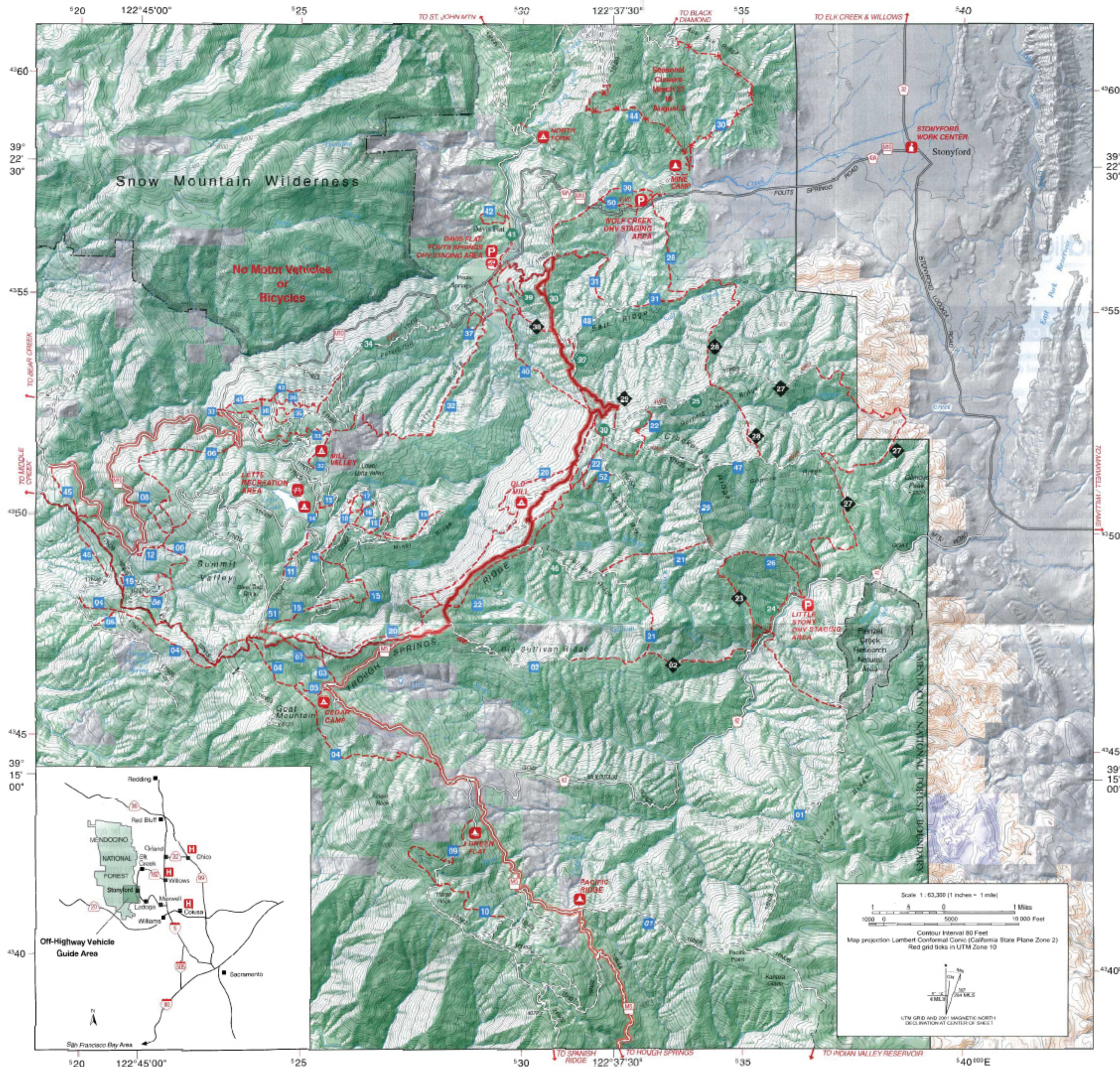


Stonyford Area OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLE GUIDE Grindstone Ranger District Mendocino National Forest, California 2001



- Paved Road:** Highway licensed & equipped vehicles only
 - Composition Unspecified:** Highway licensed & equipped vehicles only
 - Combined Use Road:** Highway licensed & OHV
 - Unimproved Road:** not recommended for passenger cars
 - Unimproved Road OHV Route:** high clearance only, not recommended for 2WD vehicles
 - OHV Corridor:** Combined use route
 - OHV Trail:** ATVs and motorcycles only
 - OHV Trail:** seasonal closure March 31 to August 2
 - Wilderness/Research Area - No motor vehicles
 - National Forest Land
